WINTER CRUISING LEAVES US SHAKEN DOWN AND (MOSTLY) READY FOR SUMMER!







Star Fleet: Black Star Regatta

I do not know how we keep getting so lucky. Last year, sunshine and lovely wind. This year, sunshine and ... wind. It maybe wasn't the strongest wind and therefore maybe not ideal, but by my account, I thought it was great. Black Star 2017 was another rousing success, despite lower turnout than in recent years.

Nine Stars, three Lasers, and two i550s came out to Budd Inlet to race around the buoys, and seals and porpoises and Orcas. PRO Rod Tharp and his scratch RC crew did a great job getting up to seven races off, though that varied by fleet. The starts followed finishes so closely that there was actually debate on the course regarding which race number we were on. They did blend together a bit.

Derek DeCouteau, returning with wife Michelle after skipping last year, roared back, taking four bullets and first place overall. Norm Smit, sailing with daughter Laura, was only a few points behind: fewer firsts, but a much more consistent day than Derek. The rest of the fleet dropped off behind that, with Foss Miller and son Forrest taking third overall and first in the woodie fleet. Casey Pruitt on a Laser and Brian Lockwood / Alex Reed on a i550, solidly won in their respective fleets, each winning all but one race.

Racing ended just in time to get to the dock and unrigged before some ugly weather rolled in. Instead of going for an eighth race, we were all tucked inside the

Viewpoint Room, eating delicious dinner, discussing best tactics, and throwing tickets into raffle item bags. The raffle itself ended up with more donation items than expected; the generosity of sailors is to be commended! Almost everyone went home having won at least something.

The details of the finances are still being figured as final expenses trickle in, but so far it looks like the BSR itself broke even as per usual, with the raffle bringing in around \$1000 of profit. The fleet has also raised around \$1200 to date specifically towards paying for the Little Yellow Runabout replacement engine. We are well on our way towards paying that off in full, which is a great relief. A special thanks to all who have donated, including many from the general SSSS body and members of the dinghy fleet. We truly appreciate your generosity. Give a shout whenever you want to get out on a Star and we'll make it happen.

As a reminder, Monday night Star sailing continues through the summer, except Memorial Day; we will sail Tuesday that week, and the week of July 4, no racing. Keep an eye on the web site or e-mail me to join the fleet list. See you out there!

RC Report MACLEAN MEMORIAL RACE/CRUISE: OPEN FOR CRUISERS AND RACERS

Summer will eventually arrive and it will bring with it Wednesday night summer buoy races, Monday Star racing, and Thursday dingy races. It is also time for all SSSS sailors to join in the Maclean Memorial Race dedicated in the memory of SSSS racer Bill Maclean. The race/cruise is open to all sailors, cruisers and racers alike, has no race fees, and is intended to get everyone out on the water. You do not have to be a racer to participate! It would be great to see Jack and Jill, double-handed, and solo sailors joining us on the water.



This year the Maclean Memorial will be a one day event on July 8th sailing from Olympia Shoal to Eagle Island and back, followed by a potluck at Swantown Marina. Looking at the tides that day, we will have the current with us outgoing through Dana Passage until 12:45 and then flooding until 19:30 so we should get good tidal pushes where we need it most. Due to our uncertain summer winds the race committee can

shorten the race at Johnson Point outgoing or returning as well as at the Eagle Island mark boat, so we will keep it to a reasonable day on the water. It should also be a beautiful evening for a potluck and nice night to stay on your boat with the full moon rising at 20:45.

To help ease the starting fears and get everyone out there, the race committee boat will call out each start sequences on the radio. We'll have a 09:30 reverse start for the nonspinnaker higher handicapped D fleet boats getting a half hour head start. Then at 10:00 the flying sail, higher handicapped B Class boats will get started, followed by the A Class boats at 10:10, and the sport S Class boats at 10:20. The mix of boats, crews and crew sizes, and permitted squirt guns, should make it a bit of a party day on the water.

For the non-racers out there, there is only one requirement, getting a handicap rating for you boat. This will be a very informal rating based simply on your boat type, model, and normal sails, no fancy measuring or other requirements. POSSIBLE COORDINATED INSTRUCTIONAL SAILING CLASS

The Sailing Society is investigating the possibility of coordinating an annual beginning sailing course with another long-time local Olympia outdoor activities club. As envisioned, the course would involve three evening classroom sessions and four required training sails over the spring and early summer of each year. Initial discussions with several skippers about taking the course students out for their required training sails indicates that there is a real interest in helping out with the course. One skipper has already volunteered to help instruct the class. We know that demand is there as a similar course in Tacoma is attracting Olympia participants and has had to turn away interested participants due to class size limitations.

This idea of a coordinated course would fit in nicely with the SSSS board's efforts to increase interest in the sport and Membership. The infusion of new sailors to our group would provide more diversity in Member ages, make family activities more viable, think Halloween Cruise, racing crew, and future skippers. If you are interested in helping with this effort please feel free to contact me. Hopefully we can have the first course in the spring of 2018!

Treasurer's Note:

2017-18 Budget

The Board has approved a budget for next year that is, with one exception, very similar to that for this year. The one exception is that our budget for printing and mailing Ship-to-Shore is 25% down because we are printing on lighter weight paper. The savings have been spread out among a number of other categories such as Reciprocals, a

budget item under Other, because we have noticed higher expenditure this year and we are paying to put SSSS in yachtdestinations.org.

The first five expense categories on the chart Club officers, which is how budgets have been traditionally shown, and the benefit is that it is clear who is responsible for the spending. The disadvantage is that it is not immediately obvious what the money goes to, so from time to time the treasurer explains:

Past Commodore expenses could be called entertainment and public relations, chiefly the June barbeque. A lot of his effort, though not money also goes into the December potluck.

A lot of **Race Chair** expenditure goes to trophies, but dues to PIYA and US Sailing also take a few hundred dollars.

The Cruise Chair spends money chiefly on food and drink for the Cruises.

What the **Program Chair** spends goes to the speakers in the form of a pre-meeting dinner, perhaps hotel

and travel expenses and, though rarely, fees for the talk.

The Secretary's budget goes to printing and some mailing of Membership forms, the SSSS Handbook, and the Eoster.

The Commodore and Treasurer have small budgets for incidentals, e.g. stamps, checks, so they are under Other in the chart.

The Vice Commodore doesn't have a budget but she or he is responsible for buying and selling

racing tactics seminar, Andrew Kerr, and Soldiers Sailing.

The total budget is around \$12,500 and there can be \$3,000 to \$4,000 in additional off-budget income/expenses.

SSSS TO BE A 501(C)7

One final note. I have been putting together an application to the IRS for SSSS to be recognized as a 501(c)7 entity. This is a designation especially for recreational clubs and will keep us tax exempt, though unfortunately it will not mean that donations to us can be deducted as charitable gifts. That would require a (c)3 application, which we would not be able to justify given our activities.

I will put a note on the SSSS web site after the end of June that shows our expenses for the year, but this is my final Ship-to-Shore article as your Treasurer. It has actually been fun. Steve Lewis has volunteered to take over, so elect him and your accounts will be in capable hands!

I first met Jean the very first day of our dinghy races. There was a little old woman helping people rig. She asked if anyone could race. I told her yes, but one needed a boat. It seemed they had all been launched. No problem. She went to her truck and pulled an El Toro out of the back. She slung it over her back like a turtle shell. It was a pretty boat, well maintained with a blue hull with bright gunnels. I said so as she carried it to the water. She kind of grunted a thank you. Then I looked in the truck and saw her show boat, all shiny bright work no paint to be seen. Eric Egge said something about seeing her at the nationals in San Diego.

Jean and Dave drove up from Shoreline because they thought the dinghy racing was something special and they wanted to be a part of it. They were for over twenty years. They came up to race from the beginning of the program until Dave got too ill. They even attended planning meetings. She liked little boats. She knew a lot about them and she shared her knowledge widely. The fleet has already missed them.

Jean sailed all her life. She told stories of racing Great Pelicans. The fleet meeting for a picnic, everyone pulling tables and chairs out of the little boats to set up on the lawn. She wrote for the S-t-S about cruising the Sound in Stars years ago. She also wrote about cruising European rivers. Still there was much more to her sailing life before she joined us than I know. They owned, at one time or another, more different kinds of boats than I can keep track of.

Jean was a sailor. We were lucky she joined us. She will be missed by more of the sailing community than just our fleet.


