Come Race

If you have been thinking of racing with us, there is no time to start like the beginning. As we start the new season we are still in the Casual Racing mode. Which is a good way to start racing your boat.

Racing gives you a reason to use your boat more; isn't that one of your reasons for joining SSSS? Racing gets you out in more varied conditions. Which will make you a better sailor. And racing is fun. Come join the fun.

If you have raced this boat with us before, than all you need do is come out. The computer has all your information and you will be assigned to the Green or Pink class. *Unless something has changed*: like new sails or major modifications. In that case see your handicapper; if your handicap changes tell me.

If you have not raced this boat with us, then you need to get handicapped, unless you have been racing down Sound and already have a PHRF handicap. See Rafe Beswick for an official PHRF handicap, good anywhere on the Salish Sea. Or Richard Bigley for a Club no spinnaker handicap, good for our local races but free.

Once you have a handicap, tell me. I need your sail number, and handicap to score you; the app does not score you without them. Your boat name and type help the RC identify you, and we would like your name. How else will we know who to say hi to on the water?

If you are looking to crew, step one is to get vaccinated. Richard Wells is starting a Crew List on line to try to help make matches. This improves on and replaces that part of the


